This appliance installation must conform with local codes and with the National Fuel Gas code ANSI Z223.1-1992 and Addenda Z223.1a-1987 or CAN 1-B149.

The appliance and its individual shut off valve must be disconnected from the gas supply piping system during any pressure testing of that system at test pressures in excess of 1/2psig. (3.5 kPa)

The appliance must be isolated from the gas supply piping system by closing its individual manual shut off valve during any pressure testing of the gas supply piping system at test pressures equal to or less than 1/2 psis. (3.5 kPa). The appliance installer must provide a 1/2 inch N.P.T. plugged tapping accessibility for test gage connection immediately upstream of the gas supply connection to the appliance.

Should overheating occur, or the gas supply fail to shut off, shut off the manual gas valve to the appliance before shutting off the electrical supply.

When the appliance is installed directly on carpeting, tile or other combustible material other than wood flooring the appliance shall be installed on a metal or wood panel extending the full width and depth of the base.

MOBILE HOME INSTALLATION

- 1. Must be mounted with 1/4" lag bolts through two holes in base.
- 2. Ground wire must be grounded to frame of mobile home.


A manufactured home (mobile home) installation must conform with the Manufactured Home construction and Safety Standard, Title 24 CFR, Part 3280, or, when such a standard is not applicable, the Standard for Manufactured Home Installations, ANSI A225.1/NFPA 501A.

APPLIANCE ASSEMBLY

- 1. Remove all items packed in the firebox.
- 2. **PRODUCT INSPECTION:** BLAZE KING Appliances are known for their quality materials and construction. Inspect all parts for damage due to shipping and to be sure that all needed parts are enclosed. If you discover a part is missing or damaged, contact your dealer immediately for replacement or repair.
- Posistion the Log Set (see page 12 & 13):

 WARNING: DANGEROUS OPERATING CONDITIONS MAY OCCUR IF THESE LOGS ARE NOT POSITIONED IN THEIR PROPER LOCATIONS. READ THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY AND REFER TO THE DIAGRAM BELOW.
- 4. Ember Placement Place embers directly over the first set of small holes in the front of the Firebox. Embers should be evenly spread across this first set of small holes.

DO NOT PLACE EMBERS OVER THE LARGER HOLES BEHIND THIS FIRST SET OF SMALL HOLES.



Place the large log on burner assembly so that the botomof the log rest against the burner assembly and the front of the log rest against the relieved corners of log holders. Center the log on the burner assembly. Make sure the curved part of the log is up. Place the small log in the log holders with the flat side to the back and the small end to your left. Make sure they are centered on the two log holders. You will find a small package of "EMBERS" and they can be broken up to the size you wish. The embers should be approximately the size of marbles. Use only the material provided with this appliance. DO NOT add more material. Arrange them over the front burner in front of the small log to resemble a coal bed.









- A. <u>BACK LOG:</u> The large log (log A) should be placed in the back of the stove close to the far back wall. The flat side of log A should rest at an angle against the flat part of the back bracket with the rough textured side of the log facing you. The curved part of Lg A should be pointing upward. Also, the knot in the log, after placing the log in the bracket, should be on the far right side.
- B. FRONT LOG: This smaller log (log B) fits in the right and left side brackets closest to you. The flat portion of log B should be placed in these two backers, the rough textured side of the log with the knot in the middle should be pointing towards you. The rough end of log B should be pointingtowards the left.



OAK LOGS



- A. <u>BACK LOG</u>: This larger log should be placed in the back of the stove close to the far back wall. The flat side of (Log A) should rest at an angle against the flat part of the back bracket with the rough textured side of the log pointing towards you. The curved part (of Log A) should be facing upwards.
- B. FRONT LOG: This smaller log fits in the right and left side brackets closest to you. The flat portion of log (B) should be placed in these two brackets. After setting this log in the brackets, the rough textured side of the log with the knot should be pointing outward toward you.
- C. <u>LEFT SIDE LOG:</u> (REGULAR SHAPED "Y"): This smaller "Y" shaped log (Log C) sits on the left side of the front and back logs (Logs A and B). (Log C) should be placed on the grooves so that the base of the "Y" is sitting on the grooves in the front log and the center of the (Y) rest against the peg on the back log.
- D. <u>RIGHT SIDE LOG: (IRREGULAR SHAPED "Y")</u>: On both sides of logs A and B, there are grooves (one on each side). The irregular shaped "Y" (log D) should be on the right side.



PLANNING FOR YOUR STOVE PLACEMENT

As you plan your installation consider the following:

The stove should be placed as central in the home as possible. Consider safety, convenience, traffic flow and the fact that the stove will need a venting system.

DUE TO HIGH TEMPERATURE THE ROOM HEATER SHOULD BE LOCATED OUT OF TRAFFIC AND AWAY FROM FURNITURE AND DRAPERIES. MINIMUM CLEARANCES SHOWN ON PAGE 17 ARE TO PREVENT WALLS AND CEILINGS FROM CATCHING ON FIRE.

For the type of vent system to be used, see page 17. Electrical Power is 115-60HZ. The stove is equipped with a fan assembly with a six-foot electrical cord. Do not route the cord in front of the stove.


WARNING

USE APPROVED FLEXIBLE GAS CONNECTIONS OR RIDGED PIPING DEPENDING ON STATE AND LOCAL CODES TO ATTACH BURNER TO GAS SUPPLY. BE SURE TO USE PROPER SIZE GAS SUPPLY LINE. GAS CONNECTION

The gas line may be installed at this time. Make sure to follow all state and local codes. It is recommended by Blaze King that gas connection be made by a Licensed and qualified installer. The appliance can be connected to the supply line with either rigid or approved flexible gas connection. Check with state and local codes.


Attach a 1/2" close nipple to the control valve at this point there must be a 1/2 inch N.P.T. plugged tee accessible for a test gage. Then the connection pipe connected to a 1/2" shut off valve, which should be mounted to the supply line.

PIPING DETAIL:


DO NOT DAMAGE OR KINK THE FLEX CONNECTOR. CHECK FOR GAS LEAKS NOTE: SOAP AND WATER SOLUTION. WITH


VENT TERMINATION CHART

Note:

The chimney shall be attached directly to the room heater and shall extend at least 3 feet above the part of the roof which it passes through.

The top of the chimney is to be at least 2 feet above the highest required elevation of any part of the roof within 10 feet of the chimney

Chimney system can be installed in a chase one inch clearance must be maintained for combustibles



HORIZONTAL TERMINATION VENT #Z0770H for Pegasus 9401

Prepare 6" pipe for painting by wiping down with straight vinegar. Rinse vinegar off with clean water and allow pipe to dry. Use high temperature paint as directed by manufacturer. Position stove in the desired location. Be sure to maintain structural integrity ceiling joists and/or wall studs. Check for wiring or plumbing in cut areas.

Start by putting a 3/16" bead of RTV Silicone about 1/4" inside plain end of 4" x 2' or 4" x 3' pipe. Slide pipe 1" onto collar of stove, make sure it is straight. DO NOT exceed 1" or the outer section will not be flush. Drill two 9/64" holes through the pipe into the collar.

Put in two 1/2" x #10 square drive screws provided. Repeat with 6" pipe, make sure seam is to the back and top ends of the pipes are even. First put 3/16" bead of black silicone on ring at base of collar. To put pipe on, squeeze into oval shape. Start one side first and rotate onto collar and push straight down. Slide pipe down until it seats in silicone. Install screws. To determine maximum and minimum pipe lengths see chart included.

NOTE: Only Blaze King pipe kits and assemblies can be used to vent this product. 5' vertical assembly #Z0766V must be used after 2' starter section on each 5' vertical rise and is NOT to be used on horizontal runs. Only 5' section #Z0776H, if needed, can be used horizontally. Maintain a 1/4" rise per Horizontal Foot.

If extending through ceiling before elbowing, the framing opening must be 8" x 8" to maintain a 1" clearance to combustible. 8-Z shaped brackets are included in the kit. One must be nailed with 90 degree bends pointing up and down centered in each 8" opening.

If not going through ceiling, install 4" elbow with screws and silicone. Install the 6" elbow in like manner. Cut the 8" round hole through the wall. Be cautious to maintain structural integrity and that no wires or plumbing are in this area. See chart for horizontal distance allowances. Also make sure to maintain 1" clearance to all combustibles. Slide trim collar over pipe before passing through the wall.

Based upon length of horizontal run and using RTV Hi-Temp silicone and securing each section with screws, extend sections of 4" and 6" pipe to 2" beyond farthest point on outside of dwelling.

To install cap, follow assembly instruction included. Slide onto pipe. Make sure pipe comes to top of lip in first screened section of cap. Drill with 9/64" through three holes in cap, through the pipe and fasten with screws provided.

VERTICAL TERMINATION VENT KITS #Z0770P for Pitched Roof & #Z0770F for Flat Roof

Prepare 6" pipe for painting by wiping pipe down with straight vinegar. Rinse vinegar off with clean water and allow pipe to dry. Position stove in the desired location. Be certain to maintain structural integrity of the ceiling and roof joists. Check for wiring or plumbing in cut areas.

Start by putting a 3/16" bead of RTV silicone about 1/4" inside of the plain end of the 4"x2' pipe. slide the pipe about 1" on to the collar of the stove, making sure it is straight. Do not exceed 1" or the next section will not work. Drill two 9/64" holes through the pipe into collar. (SEE SKETCH)

Put in the two #10x1/2" square drive screw provided. repeat with 6" pipe, making sure the seams to the back and top ends of the 4" & 6" pipes are even, first putting a 3/16" bead of black silicone seal on ring at the base of the collar. To put the pipe on the stove, squeeze the pipe squeeze the pipe creating an oval shape and starting on one side, rotate onto the collar and push straight down. Slide it down until it seats in the silicone at the base 9of the collar. Slide the trim ring over the pipe.

To determine maximum and minimum pipe length, see chart. Use as many pipe sections as necessary. Make sure to put the silicone bead on each section of pipe. Drill three 9/16" holes equally spaced around the outer pipe and fasten with the screws provided. Only the 5' pipe section (#Z0766) has a restrictor built in. This restrictor must be used on each 5' section of vertical length, except for the starter section or top section, which can be shorter than 5' and does not require a restrictor. NOTE: Only Blaze King pipe sections, #Z0766-5', #Z0765-3' and #Z0765-2' can be used on this appliance.

The frame opening through the ceiling must be 8"x8" to maintain the minimum of 1" to combustibles. Eight Z-shaped bracckets are included in the kit and must be nailed with the 90degree bends pointing up and down, in the center of each side of the 8" opening to center the pipe and maintain the 1" clearance to combustibles. SEE SKETCH

Follow the same procedure when passing through the roof.

Install the roof jack and storm collar. The pipe must extend out of the roof at least 3 feet. The top of the chimney is to be at least 2 feet above the highest required elevation of any part of the roof within 10 feet of the chimney.

To install the cap, follow cap assembly instructions included. Slide the cap on to the top of the pipe. Make sure the pipe comes to the top of the lip on the firest screened section of cap. Drill three 9/64" holes through cap and pipe. Fasted with the screws provided.

CAP ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS for #Z0762 Pegasus 9401

- 1. Center the intake screen over the 1/2" lip that protrudes out from the main housing.
- Using a 300 degree or higher silicone cement, place a 1/4" bead around the 8" inside lip of the main housing. DO NOT cover the drain hole with cement.
- 3. Slide the main housing over the 8" pipe. The longest side up with the drain hole facing down.
- 4. Attach the main housing through the flashing to the wall with the appropriate fasteners. Use the outside holes 1/4" from the corners.
- 5. Lay the center shield on it's side. Slide the two standoffs oer the tabs on the down side. the standoffs should extend dowward in the same direction as the attached pipe, towards the house.
- 6. Slide the outer shield over the two standoffs and slide the standoffs over the tabs of the outer shield. The convex side of the outer shield faces the house.
- 7. Place the 5"x2" exhaust screen between the center and top outer shields.
- 8. slide the remaining two standoffs through and into the center and outer shields.
- 9. Using a 300 degree or higher silicone cement, place a 1/4" bead around the inside of the 5" lip of the center shield.
- 10. Set the assembled section upright with the standoffs extending downward. Position the cap with the 4 holes over the standoffs and insert the 4, #10-32x4.5" stove bolts.
- 11. Position the assembled section through the intake screen with the 5" pipe over the 5" pipe extending through the wall. Secure the stove bolts into the tinnerman clips in the main housing to complete the assembly.



BLAZE KING RECOMMENDS THIS PROCEDURE BE DONE BY A QUALIFIED SERVICE PERSONNEL

- Remove the 2 screws holding the regulator plate. Remove regulator and gasket. Position new gasket over pins and install new regulator with notched corner up. 1.
- Open the front access door. 2.
- Remove embers and logs. 3.
- Remove retaining screw in lower center of door. 4.
- Remove the 2 retaining screws in pilot millivolt assembly. 5.
- Left front of burn tray and remove through door. 6.
- Change the main burner orifice by unthreading existing orifice from fitting with 1/2" wrench. Replace with an appropriate orifice. Remove pilot line by unscrewing 1/2" brass fitting. 7. Remove next 7/16th fitting. Remove the pilot orifice. Replace with an appropriate pilot orifice.
- Reverse steps 1 6 to complete conversion. 8.

The lowered oxygen content in the air and lowered gas density requires installing a different orifice in order to achieve clean combustion of the unit. Consult the unit data plate for proper high altitude orifice size and fill out the information sticker attached to the unit when field converting.

For high altitude installations, consult the local gas distributor or the authority having jurisdiction for proper rating methods.


- A. This appliance has a pilot that is lit with a push button Piezo lighter. When lighting the pilot, follow these instructions exactly.
- B. BEFORE LIGHTING smell all around the appliance area for gas. Be sure to smell next to the floor because some gas is heavier than air and will settle on the floor.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SMELL GAS:

- * OPEN WINDOWS
- * DO NOT TOUCH ANY ELECTRIC SWITCH; DO NOT USE ANY PHONE IN YOUR BUILDING.
- * EXTINGUISH ANY OPEN FLAME.

- Turn the gas control knob counter clockwise to "ON". Turn on all electric power to the appliance. 9. the thermostat to desired setting. Set




To adjust the flame so it has the proper shape and color without making soot on the glass or logs.


The primary air shutter should be set approximately 1/2 open for Natural Gas and approximately Full open for LP Gas.


Adjust the open shutter until the flame turns blue, then close the shutter until a soft red flames is obtained. The shutter is spring loaded so it will stay in that position.

If this makes soot on either the logs or glass, the setting must be opened gradually until the glass and logs stay clean.











Periodically checking the flame pattern is necessary. The flame should look approx imately like the picture. The base of the flame must not rise above the burner plate.


WIRING DIAGRAM
